Latest meeting

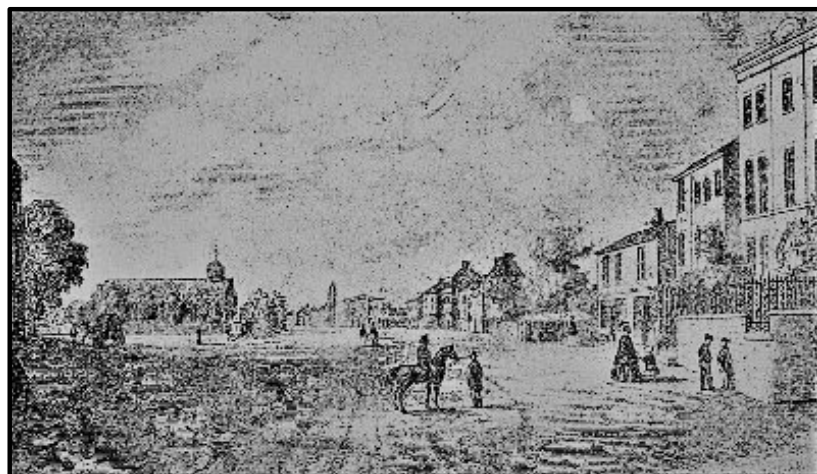
The latest meeting of the Redditch Local History Society was held on Monday 8th July 2019 at the Oasis Christian Centre, Plymouth Road

For the meeting we had an attendance of 34 members and 6 visitors, giving a total of 40 attendees. The meeting was opened by the Chairman who welcomed members and visitors.

Presentation

The presentation today was entitled 'The People of Church Green in the 19th Century' and was given by our Treasurer, Graham Smith. Graham has carried out much research on the history of Church Green and given several presentations to the Society and other organisations on this area of the town. This was a further presentation based on his work.

To clarify this timescale in the history of the town he considered it as two periods, 1800 to 1850, 'Riots, Constables and Needles', and 1850 to 1900, 'Wealth, Improvement and Gentrification.'



The period from 1800 to 1850 began badly. Redditch was typified by poor housing, low wages and lawlessness. In the early part of this period were the bread riots, where the Bromsgrove Militia were sent in to quell riots in the town. This was a failure and in 1806 the Redditch militia was created.

Early entertainment was brutal. The main interests were bull baiting, cock fighting (both of which were made illegal by before 1850) and bare knuckle boxing.

There were three contributing actions which changed this situation:

Religion: the Chapel at Bordesley was moved to the Church Green in 1807 and became the Chapel on The Green.

Education: 'Dame' schools were created and the first National School was opened in 1846.

Police Force: The Worcestershire Constabulary was created in 1839 which created a professional and organised force to replace the traditional, poorly paid and organised, Parish Constables.

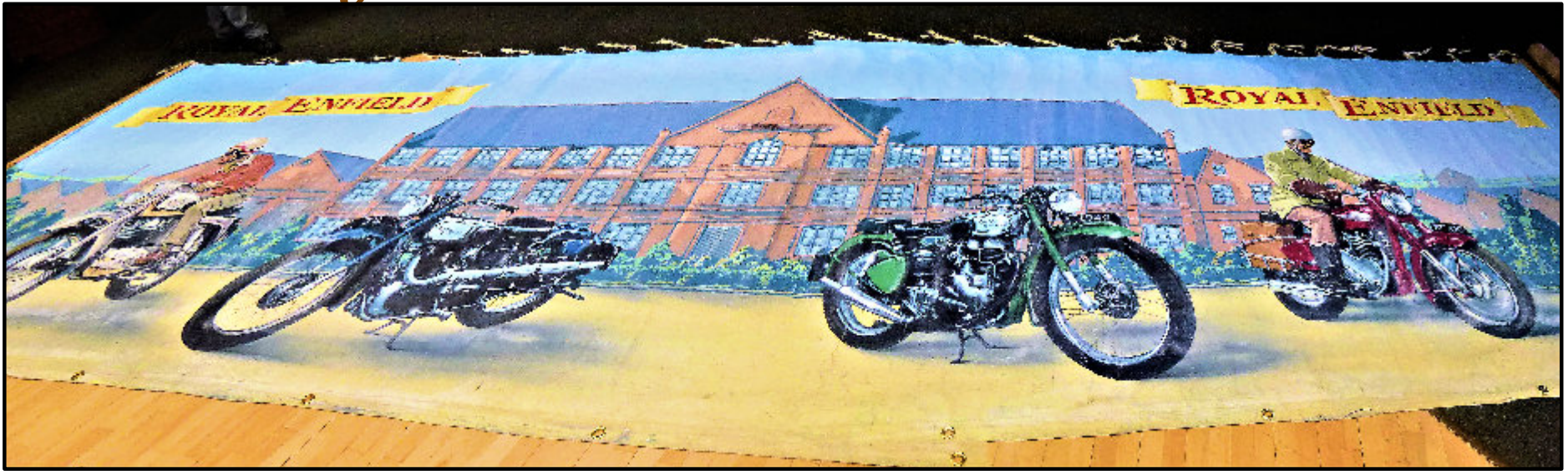
In 1800 the population of Redditch was about 1,000 and by 1900 this had increased 14 fold to 14,000.

Graham moved onto this later period from 1850 to 1900 with the important changes which occurred in the town centre and Church Green with St Stephens Church, Smallwood Hospital, the Literary and Scientific Institute, the Bartleet Fountain, the Bandstand and the wonderful range of buildings in Church Green East. It would have looked very much as we see it today - but clean, bright and brand new!

This brief summary cannot give justice to Graham's entertaining and wide ranging presentation and it was much appreciated by the audience.
